This notice is to advise participants of intended changes to the Racing Queensland (**RQ**) Harness Handicapping Procedure (the **Procedure**) effective from January 1, 2025.

Summary of Changes – January 1, 2025

- 4YO Concession introduced at 8 points (reduced to 4 points on July 1 each season).
- 2YO Concession raised to 10 points.
- Maximum of 14 starters from stand at Albion Park reduced to 12 (feature races excluded).
- Marburg seeded positions reintroduced (1,2,3,6,7,8,9,4,5).
- Redcliffe field size increased to 10 for mobile races above 2000m.
- Amended Field Selection Point table.
- QBRED Features – ranking list removed, qualify via Heats or manual field selection.

A full copy of the Procedure is available for review in the following pages, with details of the key changes below.

4YO Concession Introduced

To address the reduced 4YO horse population in recent years (4YO starters vs total starters fell from 18.6% in 2021 to 15.7% by the end of 2023) and industry feedback about the future of young horses, in particular 3YO horses turning 4YO on January 1, a 4YO Concession will be introduced.

The 4YO concession = 8 points for the first 6 months of the racing season before being reduced to 4 points on July 1 each season.

The aim is to increase the confidence of industry members regarding opportunities for young horses and to build the racing pool of 4YO horses.

2YO Concession

The 2YO Concession will increase to 10 points.

While it is preferred that 2YO horses race against their own age, it is acknowledged that on occasion due to a lack of 2YOs in the racing pool at certain times of the season a trainer may wish to place their 2YO in a Ratings race against older horses.

If so, a 10 point Concession aims to provide stakeholders confidence their horse can be competitive if given the opportunity to compete in an open age Ratings race.

Albion Park Stand Start Field Size

The field size for a standing start race at Albion Park for both gaits will be reduced from a maximum of 14 starters to 12 (excludes feature races).



Reasons for the change include addressing the drop back rate of horses and providing trotters with increased racing opportunities by spreading the population across other programmed races, in turn helping more races hold up.

Marburg Seeded Positions

Seeded barrier positions at Marburg will be reintroduced with the aim of improving racing competitiveness at the venue by the better handicapping of races.

The new seeded barrier draw configuration will be:

- 1,2,3,6,7,8,9,4,5.

Redcliffe Field Size Increase

Following a proposal from the Redcliffe Harness Racing Club, the Redcliffe maximum field size will increase from 9 starters to 10 starters for all races over 2000m only.

This change is expected to not only drive higher turnover but provide more opportunities to participants to gain a start with their horses.

Revised Field Selection Point distribution

Amendments to the distribution of Field Selection Points in Queensland will also come into effect.

These amendments are being made to better align the points allocated to the current prizemoney structure and to assist with balloted horses gaining starts sooner.

Amendments include:

- Redcliffe Wednesday, Thursday and Albion Park Friday races worth \$6,200 will be allocated one less point than previously (11 points to the winner); and
- Redcliffe Wednesday and Thursday races worth \$4,600 will be allocated one less point than previously (10 points to the winner).

QBRED Feature Race Changes

In 2025 the QBRED Feature Race Ranking system will be removed.

Qualifications for all QBRED feature races will be as follows:

- A. QBRED 2YO & 3YO Breeders Classic:
 - (a) Qualification for Final via Heats;
 - (b) All horses must start in a Heat to be eligible for the Final;
 - (c) All horses guaranteed a start in a Heat;
 - (d) Qualification for the Final is by the highest finishing position then fastest individual time.

- B. QBRED 2YO & 3YO Triad:
 - (a) Qualification for Final via Heats;
 - (b) All horses must start in a Heat to be eligible for the Final;
 - (c) All horses guaranteed a start in a Heat;
 - (d) Qualification for the Final is by the highest finishing position then fastest individual time.

- C. QBRED 4YO Triad:
 - (a) Qualification for the Final based on the Manual Race Field Selection Policy with Handicappers determining the best credentialled starters for each Final;
 - (b) No Heats will be drawn.

A Consolation will be considered if more horses than anticipated nominate for either of the 4YO QBRED Triad Finals.

Stakeholders and interested parties wishing to provide feedback on the intended changes to the Procedure should submit feedback as per the details at the top of this document.



HARNES HANDICAPPING PROCEDURE

1. Background

This Procedure is made under the Racing Queensland (**RQ**) Handicapping and Grading Policy (the **Policy**) with the purpose to provide details of the systems of handicapping used in the Queensland harness racing industry.

The Procedure is named the Harness Handicapping Procedure (the **Procedure**).

2. Relevant Rules & Scope

2.1 Australian Handicapping Rules / Ratings Based Handicapping System

The rules that apply in relation to the handicapping and field selection of races conducted in Queensland are comprised of:

- (a) the Australian Handicapping Rules as made, rescinded or altered by Harness Racing Australia (**HRA**) from time to time; and
- (b) the local handicapping rules outlined in this Procedure.

HRA adopted a 'Ratings Based Handicapping System' as the basis for handicapping in Australia with effect from July 1, 2019.

All information regarding the National Rating Handicapping System can be found in the Australian Handicapping Rules on the HRA website <https://www.harness.org.au/rules/AUSTHCPR.PDF>.

If there is any inconsistency between this Procedure and the Australian Handicapping Rules, the Procedure will prevail to the extent of the inconsistency.

3. Application

3.1 Field Selection

Race fields are selected by using one of four methods:

- Automatic Race Field Selection (Section 3.1.1);
- Manual Race Field Selection (Section 3.1.2);
- Divided Conditions (Section 3.1.3); and
- Discretionary Handicaps (Section 3.1.4).

3.1.1 Automatic Field Selection System

- (a) Except for Metropolitan meetings and other chosen feature events, the fields for Queensland race meetings are selected in accordance with the Automatic Field Selection System unless otherwise stipulated in the race conditions.
- (b) Horses will be awarded field selection points based on their finishing order in any race they contest. The number of points awarded depends on the meeting type and tiered prizemoney level structure (refer table below).

- (c) The point scores for each horse are calculated on points they have earned over their last five engagements. Of the five point-scoring runs the worst point score is removed and the remaining four are accumulated to give the total point score (see example below).

- (d) All races under the Automatic Field Selection System will be selected in descending point score order unless otherwise stated in race conditions. Selected races only may be selected in LOWEST to highest point score order.
- (e) A horse will be awarded 7 field selection points if it is balloted from a race selected using the Automatic Field Selection System. These ballot points are treated as a points scoring performance and will replace such horse's LOWEST points scoring performance. This will not be applicable under the following scenarios:
- (i) When a horse has an unfulfilled engagement;
 - (ii) When a horse is a late nomination;
 - (iii) When a horse is deemed ineligible at acceptance time;
 - (iv) When a horse is balloted from a race having gained a start in another race on the same day;
 - (v) When a horse is balloted from a race having already been balloted from another race on the same day;
 - (vi) If the horse is declared an emergency but is scratched;
 - (vii) If the race is declared a 'no-race' or is abandoned;
 - (viii) When the race field selection is based from lowest to highest point score order; or
 - (ix) When the total number of field selection points will decrease if 7 points are awarded.



- (f) Ballot points are to be credited to a horse's field selection points total after the running of the race meeting from which the horse has been balloted. Incoming ballot points replace the lowest point score in a horse's last five engagements.
- (g) When a horse qualifies to race it will be initially allotted a points score of 28 points (four 'starts' of 7 gift points). The points score of a newly qualified horse will then be calculated in the same manner as for a horse with a racing history, i.e., by considering the horse's last five points scoring performances and discarding the lowest point scoring performance so that the total of the remaining four points scoring performances becomes the points score used in the Automatic Field Selection System.
- (h) In the event that a ballot is required from horses on the same point score as horses that have not yet had a race start (i.e., 28 points), the horse which has not yet started will be considered as having 7 gift points at its last engagement which may provide the opportunity to gain a start over a horse which has only had one start but earned less than 7 points at that start (refer example below).

In the above example the first starter will gain the run over the horse which has had only one race start considering the points at the last engagement (7 vs 3).

- (i) For all races selected in accordance with the Queensland Automatic Field Selection System, in the event of two or more horses being equal with the same points score, a count back will determine which horse gains a start, with preference given to the horse which earned the highest points at its last point scoring engagement. If both/all horses earned the same points, this procedure will be repeated through each previous point scoring engagement. If both/all horses cannot be separated a random ballot will determine which horse/s gain a start.
- (j) A horse that already has an engagement as a starter in a race at Acceptance Time for a given meeting will be deemed as having an 'unfulfilled engagement'. Horses with an unfulfilled engagement will only be selected after horses without an engagement unless otherwise stipulated in the race conditions.
- (k) If a horse is nominated for two different meetings conducted on different days but acceptances close on the same day, the trainer may indicate that he is willing to start the horse on both days if circumstances permit. Should the horse gain a start in its preferred event it will be deemed as having an unfulfilled engagement when being considered for the other race meeting.
- (l) Pursuant to AHR Rule 133 (1) & (2) every effort will be made to meet the above conditions, however, the inclusion of any horse over another shall not be grounds for requesting a redraw, nor shall any liability of any nature be incurred by RQ because of any error. In all cases the decision of the RQ Handicapping Panel will be final.

3.1.2 Manual Race Field Selection Policy

- (a) Fields for Metropolitan race meetings are selected by the RQ Field Selection Panel in accordance with the Manual Race Field Selection Policy.



- (b) The Automatic Field Selection System and the unfulfilled engagement rule are not applicable at Metropolitan race meetings.
- (c) The best credentialed horses in every race will be selected with the RQ Handicapping Panel referring to the following horse performance information:
 - (All information assessed equally)
 - (i) Current Figure Form (last 6 race starts);
 - (ii) Margins Beaten;
 - (iii) Mile Rates;
 - (iv) Class of Opposition;
 - (v) Class of Races;
 - (vi) Positions in Running;
 - (vii) Barrier Draws;
 - (viii) Interference Received;
 - (ix) Standing starts – all previous standing start form will be assessed in addition to current figure form over the last 10 starts.
- (d) The horses, which in the opinion of the RQ Handicapping Panel have the best overall form based on the above criteria, will be declared as starters in the field.
- (e) Multiple stable runners can be drawn as the only selection criteria is form as per criteria in Point 3.1.2 (c) (unless otherwise stated in race conditions).
- (f) A horse that has not previously had a race start has no exposed form and as such horses that have had a race start will be included first under the Manual Field Selection Policy. Trial form will not be considered. If balloting is required with multiple unraced horses a random ballot will be conducted to determine which of the unraced horses gain a start.
- (g) Permission may be granted at the sole discretion of RQ for other clubs to apply for these conditions on selected events.
- (h) Pursuant to AHR Rule 133 (1) & (2) every effort will be made to meet the above conditions, however, the inclusion of any horse over another shall not be grounds for requesting a redraw, nor shall any liability of any nature be incurred by RQ or any club official because of any error. In all cases the decision of the RQ Handicapping Panel will be final.

3.1.3 Divided Conditioned Racing

- (a) If required divided conditioned racing may be used within a race program.
- (b) Horses may be nominated for an open race code with nominations to be split at the discretion of the RQ Handicapping Panel who will frame the race conditions and barrier draw to best suit those nominated. The aim of this method of selection is to achieve even and competitive racing.
- (c) Where possible the RQ Handicapping Panel will attempt to split nominations in similar age, lifetime win or national rating groups, however, this cannot always be guaranteed due to the variety of horses that may be nominated for this type of program.
- (d) Pursuant to AHR Rule 133 (1) & (2) every effort will be made to meet the above conditions, however, the inclusion of any horse over another shall not be grounds for requesting a redraw, nor shall any liability of any nature be incurred by RQ because of any error. In all cases the decision of the RQ Handicapping Panel will be final.

3.1.4 Discretionary Handicaps

- (a) All discretionary handicaps are selected at the discretion of the RQ Handicapping Panel based on the Manual Race Field Selection Policy, however, considering the last 10 starts and



previous standing start form in addition to the standard criteria. A horse may be re-handicapped by the RQ Handicapping Panel after a subsequent winning performance if deemed necessary.

3.2 Race Splits / Allocation

- (a) Where a race is being split to allow for the maximum number of races budgeted per meeting to be conducted, RQ Handicappers will use discretion to determine the best method of splitting such race. Whilst in most cases the standard split may be utilised options considered are:
- (i) Standard Race Split:
 - A. Owners;
 - B. Trainers;
 - C. Drivers;
 - (ii) Divided by sex;
 - (iii) Field Selection Points;
 - (iv) Prizemoney won in last 3 to 6 starts;
 - (v) Top division at advertised race stake and bottom division of lower race stake; and
 - (vi) Manual race split (Handicappers discretion).
- (b) Any decision on how or if to divide a race will be based on the following criteria:
- (i) Maximize wagering turnover;
 - (ii) Competitiveness of race;
 - (iii) Number of acceptors for the race;
 - (iv) Quality of acceptors;
 - (v) Available stake distribution;
 - (vi) Impacts on other races or subsequent meetings; and
 - (vii) Number of available races to be conducted at the race meeting.
- (c) The following criteria will be considered in determining whether a programmed race should go ahead or be deleted:
- (i) Maximise wagering turnover;
 - (ii) Number of acceptors for the race;
 - (iii) Number of acceptors for other races;
 - (iv) Quality of acceptors;
 - (v) Competitiveness of race;
 - (vi) Alternate racing opportunities;
 - (vii) Available stake distribution;
 - (viii) Impacts on other races or subsequent meetings; and
 - (ix) Number of available races to be conducted at the race meeting.
- (d) RQ Handicappers may, at their discretion, combine any race in an effort to achieve a race field or maintain a maximum number of races at a race meeting. RQ Handicappers will only combine races if deemed viable to do so. In all cases the RQ Handicappers decision is final.

3.3 Band Handicapping

- (a) The Queensland Band system is a local method of handicapping races held at Metropolitan meetings and selected races at provincial meetings.
- (b) Originally introduced to replicate Metropolitan (M-class) racing, the Band system provides a level of handicapping for the Queensland Metropolitan races which fell under the \$15,000 national threshold of a Metropolitan Penalty race as defined under the Australian Handicapping Rules.



- (c) The inclusion of Band racing assists in identifying horses with 0 Metropolitan wins, 1 Metropolitan win etc., and therefore provides another level of racing options for each horse.
- (d) A Band Penalty will apply to winners of races worth \$12,000 or more (some exclusions may apply).
- (e) Band classes are as follows:
 - (i) No Band (Horses that have not won a Band Penalty race).
 - (ii) Band 5 (Winners of one Band Penalty race).
 - (iii) Band 4 (Winners of two Band Penalty races).
 - (iv) Band 3 (Winners of three Band Penalty races).
 - (v) Band 2 (Winners of four Band Penalty races).
 - (vi) Band 1 (Winners of five or more Band Penalty races).
- (f) A drop back in Band class applies for horses that have not won a race in their last 10 starts (Band 5 limit).
- (g) Any horse will take a Band Penalty for a win of a Band Penalty race. Races excluded from a Band Penalty are:
 - (i) All races restricted to 2YOs only.
 - (ii) All races restricted to 3YOs only.
 - (iii) Races restricted to horses with a National Rating no higher than 75 that are advertised as a Rating Penalty only race.
 - (iv) Age races up to 4YO with a value no higher than \$50,000.
 - (v) QBRED 4YO Feature race with a value no higher than \$75,000.
- (h) Band assessment of interstate or overseas horses:
 - (i) A Band Penalty will apply for each win of a race valued at \$15,000 or more.
 - (ii) Excludes 2YO or 3YO age races, maiden races or any race won by a 3YO that is classified as a 3YO or older race.
 - (iii) Also excludes any Australian race restricted to horses with a NR no higher than NR75.

3.4 Concessions

3.4.1 Driver

Available on races advertised 'DC' (Driver Concession):

- (a) Concession Driver with 0 to 100 lifetime wins = 5 Rating Point concession (retained until 101st win is achieved).
- (b) Concession Driver with 101 to 250 lifetime wins = 3 Rating Point concession (retained until 251st win is achieved).
- (c) Concession Term = 7 years from date of first attaining a B-Grade driver's license.
- (d) 251 lifetime wins = claim outdriven.
- (e) Metropolitan Concession claim available for 50 wins at a Metropolitan meeting or of a Metropolitan race.

3.4.2 Mare

Available on races advertised 'MC' (Mare Concession):

- (a) Mares Concession = 5 points.

3.4.3 Age

Available on all races unless stated in race conditions:



- (a) 2YO Concession = 10 points.
- (b) 3YO Concession = 8 points.
- (c) 4YO Concession = 8 points (to June 30).
- (d) 4YO Concession = 4 points (from July 1 to December 31).

3.4.4 Trotters

Available on all races unless stated in race conditions:

- (a) Trotters in Pacers race = 20 points.

3.5 Field Sizes

3.5.1 Albion Park (Except when emergency is drawn)

- (a) All 2YO (MS & SS) = 10 starters.
- (b) 3YO+ 1660m (MS) = 10 starters.
- (c) 3YO+ 2138m or longer (MS) = 12 starters.
- (d) 3YO+ all distances (SS) = 12 starters.
- (e) 3YO+ Feature races all distances (SS) = 14 starters.

3.5.2 Redcliffe (Except when emergency is drawn)

- (a) All 2YO (MS & SS) = 9 starters.
- (b) 3YO+ 1780m (MS) = 9 starters.
- (c) 3YO+ 2040m or longer (MS) = 10 starters.
- (d) 3YO+ all distances (SS) = 12 starters.

3.5.3 Marburg (Except when emergency is drawn)

- (a) All 2YO (MS & SS) = 9 starters.
- (b) 3YO+ all distances (MS) = 9 starters.
- (c) 3YO+ all distances (SS) = 10 starters.

3.5.4 Grass Track or other thoroughbred venue

- (a) All 2YO (MS & SS) = 8 starters.
- (b) 3YO+ all distances (MS) = 9 starters.
- (c) 3YO+ all distances (SS) = 10 starters.

3.6 Seeded Preferential Barrier Draws

3.6.1 Mobile start races

In mobile start races at:

- (a) Albion Park, the allocation of barriers are seeded in the following sequence:
 - 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 6, 10, 7, 11, 12 and 13.
- (b) Redcliffe, the allocation of barriers are seeded in the following sequence:
 - 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, 5, 6, 10 and 11.
- (c) Marburg the allocation of barriers are seeded in the following sequence:
 - 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, 4 and 5.
- (d) Grass Track or other thoroughbred venue, the allocation of barriers are NOT seeded and are drawn in the following sequence:
 - 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10.

3.6.2 Standing start races

In standing start races, seeded barrier draws do not apply.



3.7 Barrier Draw Types

- (a) The below barrier draw types are some examples of barrier draw selection methods used in Queensland which may be applied to assist in grading a race:

RBD	Random Barrier Draw
PBD/NR	Preferential Barrier Draw on National Rating
DBD	Discretionary Barrier Draw
PBD/CLAIM	Preferential Barrier Draw on Claiming Price
PBD/\$L3	Preferential Barrier Draw on earnings at the last 3 starts
PBD/\$L4	Preferential Barrier Draw on earnings at the last 4 starts
PBD/\$L5	Preferential Barrier Draw on earnings at the last 5 starts
PBD/\$L6	Preferential Barrier Draw on earnings at the last 6 starts
PBD/\$TS	Preferential Barrier Draw on earnings This Season
PBD/TSW	Preferential Barrier Draw on This Season Wins
PBD/TSWOE	Preferential Barrier Draw on This Seasons Win Only Earnings
PBD/\$LS	Preferential Barrier Draw on earnings Last Season
PBD/\$LT	Preferential Barrier Draw on Lifetime earnings
PBD/LTW	Preferential Barrier Draw on Lifetime Wins
PBD/FSP	Preferential Barrier Draw on Field Selection Points
PBD/AGE	Preferential Barrier Draw on Age
PBD/SEX	Preferential Barrier Draw on Sex
PBD/WOE	Preferential Barrier Draw on Win Only Earnings

- (b) Some barrier draw types may be applied in unison, e.g.:
- (i) PBD/AGE/SEX = Preferential draw on age first and then sex; or
 - (ii) PBD/NR/\$L4 = Preferential barrier draw on National Rating first then earnings at the last 4 starts.
